 The Wedding at Temple Emanuel of Pascack Valley

The Marriott Hotel, Park Ridge NJ

This newly renovated hotel is located about 1.6 miles from the synagogue where the wedding will be held. All of the events prior to the wedding will be held at the hotel. The hotel has an indoor/outdoor pool, whirlpool and health club on the premises, so feel free to bring your swimsuits and workout attire.

We have arranged a discounted room rate of \$89 per night for wedding guests for all nights of their stay. Rooms may be reserved beginning April 12, 2002, and will be available on a firstcome-first-served basis. We have guaranteed 150 room nights at the hotel. We strongly recommend that you book your reservations between April 12 and April 30, 2002 to be guaranteed room availability and this rate. Please call the Park Ridge Marriott toll-free at (800)-882-1038 and request rooms in the "Weinstein/Rosenthal block". room Unreserved rooms in the block will be released on July 12, 2002, and rooms booked after that date will be quoted the best rate available at that time.

Flying into Newark Airport

The nearest airport to the hotel is Newark International Airport (38 miles), but you can fly into any New York City area airport. Fares are usually lower at LaGuardia, but travel to the hotel is more difficult and more expensive.



Since we expect a sizable contingent from out of town, arranged for special discounted airfares with Continental Airlines, which has a hub in Newark. Continental Airlines will

provide a discount of up to 10% off published fares for wedding attendees traveling to and from Newark, NJ between July 28 and August 11, 2002. *The best discounts are available if tickets are purchased 60 days or more prior to travel.* Various restrictions apply. For more information, contact your travel agent or Continental MeetingWorks at 1-800-468-7022. Please provide Reference Number V9J99W and Z Code ZR25 to obtain the discount.

Travel to the Hotel



The drive from Newark Airport to the hotel is 38 miles, and takes about 45 minutes. If you are traveling as a group of three or more people, we would recommend renting a car.

If you would like to take a shuttle service directly to the hotel, you can call TBT Limousine and Shuttle Service at 1-800-654-6642 to make reservations. The cost is \$36.00 plus gratuity per person. Airbrook Shuttle at 1-800-432-1826 will take you to Montvale for \$30.00 plus gratuity per person. The Park Ridge Marriott van can be called from there to pick you up and take you to the hotel.

The hotel has a shuttle van to provide free transportation for guests to and from locations near the hotel.

Travel to the Wedding Ceremony

The wedding will be held at Temple Emanuel of the Pascack Valley, which is located about 1.6 miles from the hotel. If you have a car, rented or your own, we will provide directions on how to get back and forth from the hotel to the synagogue. If you have extra seats in your car, please let us know that weekend, so we can match people who need transportation with people who can provide it.

Babysitting

Children are welcome at our Friday night and Saturday

morning events. We would be happy to put you in contact with a baby-sitter for the Saturday night event and the Sunday wedding. Please let us know if you will need babysitting by calling or emailing one of the "cast of characters."

New York City, here I come!!!

If you've traveled a long way and want to add some time in New York City to your itinerary, you may want to consider expanding your trip by a few days on either side of the weekend. We encourage you *AVOID* driving your car into New York City, if possible. Public transportation is excellent and can easily get you around the city via bus or subway.



To get into New York City, you can take the Red and Tan Bus 11A from Park Ridge Town Center. The hotel van will take

you there and pick you up. The bus arrives at the Port Authority Bus Station in NYC at 42th Street and Eighth Avenue.

Lower East Side and the Tenement Museum: Tour carefully restored tenement apartments and learn about the lives of immigrants. Closed Monday. 97 Orchard St. phone: 212-431-0233 www.tenement.org

Chinatown: A labyrinth of narrow streets with frenetic shopping activity and restaurants galore. Between Canal and Pell Streets and 6th Avenue and the Bowery.

Greenwich Village: Longtime artist community; lovely place to stroll and browse. Houston Street north to 14th Street, Broadway west to the Hudson River. www.greenwichvillagenyc.com

Ellis Island and the **Statue of Liberty**: Trace the steps of immigrant ancestors. Take the Circle Line "Statue of Liberty Ferry" at Battery Park (Lower West Side of Manhattan). Ferry information: 212-269-5755.
